Chair Yoga for Parkinson's

Music Therapy

Music therapy is defined as the clinical use of music and music interventions by a board-certified music therapist (MT-BC) to address nonmusical functions such as motor movement, communication, and cognition. Music therapy can increase activity in the reward centers of the brain, specifically the release of dopamine in response to music, and can improve the vocal intensity, intelligibility, and conversational speech of Parkinson's patients. Join us for a twice-a-month FREE music therapy session which will include vocal exercises, singing and other activities such as drumming and instrumentation. In addition, the program offers a choir, called the Happy Bunch, which selects music to perform in the community several times a year.

Movement as Medicine (Dance for Parkinson's)

This is a class that incorporates various dance and movement forms to address balance, flexibility and spatial awareness with live musical accompaniment.



Creative Drama: Discover Your Inner Character
